

BoDean Asphalt Co. Updates

Santa Rosa City Council approves BoDean Expansion

On June 19th, City Council members Mayor Ernesto Olivares, John Sawyer, Scott Bartley and Jake Ours approved the addition of three huge new storage silos at BoDean Asphalt Company. Dozens of residents, neighbors and parents appealed to the City Council to require additional study since it is unknown what impacts the asphalt plant has on the surrounding residents and downtown area. John Sawyer, council member, said," I wouldn't want to live next to an asphalt plant..." but still voted against any additional studies. Marsha Vas Dupre, Susan Gorin and Gary Wysocky were in favor of the Environmental Impact Reports.

Your Input is Needed

The Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) is soliciting public comments on BoDean's proposal to install three new 82-foot tall asphalt storage silos at their Maxwell Court plant. **LETTERS ARE DUE BY JULY 26, 2012.** If you want some ideas on what to highlight in your letter, describe any air quality issues you have experienced, and discuss any concerns you might have about a permit that would allow for production of 759,000 tons/year. BoDean has produced an average of 150,000 tons/year for the past 10 years, and produced close to 250,000 tons in 2011.




