## A New Shakespeare Festival in the Heart of Downtown Santa Rosa.

Shakespeare in the Cannery July 18<sup>th</sup> -August 23<sup>rd</sup>- Fridays & Saturdays at 8 p.m

The six-week engagement of Romeo and Juliet offers people the chance to wine and dine under the summer night sky while enjoying an inventive take on Shakespeare. The site of the former California Packing Company's Plant No. 5 in Santa Rosa's Railroad Square will be transformed into an outdoor theater, complete with solar-powered stage lighting and an innovative set. The cast features local, professional actors and musicians. West Ender Alan Kaplan plays the part of Friar Laurence.

Artistic Director David Lear, a 30 yr. theater veteran and Martin Hamilton, director of the Arlene Francis Center worked together to create this new venue and hence was born, Shakespeare in the Cannery. The production promises to revitalize the landmark cannery ruins, rescuing the site from the blight that has plagued it in recent years. Shakespeare in the Cannery will be sustainable, green and firmly based in strong, long-lasting community partnerships. General Admission \$25, \$5 discount if you ride bike to event. 
