A New Neighbor Reflects on the West End

I moved to the West End neighborhood in August of 2007. I had lived in Arizona all of my adult life, making the move to S. R. was a transition for me. After living here awhile I started walking around the neighborhood...what I saw a medley of homessmall, large, newer, historic with a few duplexes here and there. They were also in various conditions ...some were very nice with pretty yards and flowers....others could use some work.

One of my walks took me by 133 7th Street, a great old house that had been terribly neglected and abusedit was a mess!!!! I felt sad every time I walked by this house. One day I ran into Betsy Hall and who told me she had bought the house and was going to refurbish it. She invited me inside to see the house....wow....what a shock. I thought Betsy had surely lost her mind.

I became very curious about previous owners and original families that had lived there.....then I became captivated. I have been able to find deeds from 1908 to 2012 by doing research at the So. Co. Records. The earliest occupant that I could find was the Eugene F. Heath family who rented the house in 1900 and owned it by 1908. The family — including Eugene (father) and Mary (mother) along with their four children Clarence, Annie, Maude and Guy.... had lots of boarders living with them. I have come to believe this was a way to help with expenses and also to give single folks a place to live. I have hit a dead end with my search as far as ownership goes for this old stately old house before 1900 — but hope to find out more.

So....why would a West Ender put in so much time, effort and money to fix up a dilapidated old house??? After 5 years, I have come to know a lot of the people living here. We are a very mixed group of people but we care very much for the neighborhood and will stand up and be counted in the fight to keep it growing into the kind of neighborhood most folks would love to live in. In the last four years there have been at least nine houses refurbished – a new house being built – tell me this neighborhood isn't coming around!!!! Thank you Betsy Hall for buying this property and having a vision of beauty....thanks to all of those workers who have brought their crafts to help with the process, the neighbors who have jumped in when and where they were needed.

The SMART train is coming – this will be where everyone wants to live. There is still a lot to learn about the history for this part of town and the older folks are telling the stories....I am always willing to listen.



The West End Neighborhood Association's stated purpose: "shall be to provide input to city agencies regarding the needs and desires of the West End Neighborhood particularly in the areas of crime prevention, current or planned developments, condition of streets, lighting, landscaping as directly impacts the West End Neighborhood and to continue to work to upgrade the quality of the West End Neighborhood." The W. E. Board meets twice a year and at the last meeting voted to expand the board. Eleven residents now make up the board of interested West Enders willing to meet and discuss our goals and direction. The two new board mem-

Santa Rosa City Council Sides with BoDean Asphalt Plant

On election day, November 6th. City Council members Mayor Ernesto Olivares, John Sawyer, Scott Bartley and Jake Ours overturned the Design Review Boards decision to reject the plans for the 3 new proposed silos that would soar over 27 feet above the typical building height for the area. Scott Bartley, who voted for the silos, said that landscaping might help the look of the new project. The project is currently involved in a lawsuit. There's A TRAIN coming! Most of us know the SMART train is coming to the West End. Track work began this Fall and other improvements will follow in 2013. Thanks to SMART's hard work the construction is ahead of schedule and test trains may be running through our neighborhood by the end of next year. Commuter service could start in about 25 months.

The following is a list of crossings scheduled for upgrade by the end of year. Dates may change subject to weather as we head into the rainy season.

- 9th Street Santa Rosa
 11/27 (Start 7:00 AM) to 11/30 (End 6:00 PM)
- 7th Street Santa Rosa (date pending)
 12/4 (Start 7:00 AM) to 12/6 (End 6:00 PM)
- 8th Street Santa Rosa (date pending) 12/11 (Start 7:00 AM) to 12/21 (End 6:00 PM) Please note that the 8th Street crossing closure is taking longer due to the relocation of a water line and the installation of a new sewer line.


