Classic Neighbors ◆ Anita Mendia

Long Time Resident Anita Mendia Passed away on October 18, 2016 at the age of 93. In her honor, we are reprinting an article from July 2006.

Anita Mendia has been a resident of the West End Neighborhood since 1969. She was born on July 26, 1923 in El Rosario Nayarit, Mexico and moved to the U. S. in 1951 with her husband Ricardo. Before living in Santa Rosa's West




End District, Anita and Ricardo lived in Healdsburg and Petaluma. Ricardo worked on various ranches in Healdsburg doing fieldwork and later worked in Novato and worked as a landscaper. In 1969, Anita and Ricardo were informed by a friend that a house in the West End was for sale and they purchased the home on West 8th Street. They moved into the 2 bedroom &

1 bath house with their six children: Ricardo, Theresa, Francisco, Ana, Irene and Roberto. Anita shared with me about some of her fondest memories of living in the West End. She spoke of hearing the train "horn" and recalls enjoying the sound a lot. She wonders why they ever stopped running the train and hopes that it will return. Anita also spoke of an incident when her youngest son, Robert got hurt on his bicycle on Boyce St. and Nick Bastoni (husband of Marie Bastoni) carried Robert home. Anita explained that the most enjoyable aspect of living in the West End District was "the neighbors". She stated, "My neighbors, Rosie Babbini and Estella Bertolini were special friends and neighbors."

Anita received her American citizenship on April 6, 1999 and presently lives in her West 8th St. Home with her dog companion, "Pepeto". Anita continues to enjoy living in the West End District and can often be found walking around the neighborhood with Pepeto. I suggest stopping and talking with her- She is a wonderful lady and a pleasure to spend time with. Thanks so much Anita!

DeTurk Winery Village Update


Preliminary Design Review and Landmark Alteration were **both** denied at a joint meeting of the Design Review Board and Cultural Heritage Board on Thursday, November 3, 2016. The meeting took over 6 hours and 40 minutes.

The project proposes 185 units with 15 of those units for very low income and 20,000 Sq Ft of commerical space with 130 off-street parking spaces. The next step would be for the developer to appeal the denied project to City Council.

Food for thought: Compare that to the Southeast Greenway that currently proposes only 150 living units (at the most!) on its 57 acre site.
