It was an improvement but there continued to be problems so Public Works has formally evaluated the issue and an "All Way" stop has been approved and will be installed in the near future.

# **Downtown Enforcement Team**

The Downtown Enforcement Team (DET) consists of 4 officers and 1 sergeant on bicycle patrol and has the primary responsibility of enforcing all laws throughout the downtown area as well as beat 9. Their main concentration is the downtown footprint and Railroad Depot area. They participate in special operations targeting municipal code violations, drug complaints and general quality of life issues. They also participate in other related activities that support the goal of improving safety within the downtown area.

#### Responsibilities of the DET

- Enforce laws in all areas of the City of Santa Rosa.
- Evaluate and respond to merchant and neighborhood complaints.
- Provide both oral and written testimony in court.
- Maintain proficient bicycle riding skills (POST certified Basic Police Bicycle Patrol Course).
- Attend and participate in Neighborhood/Merchant meetings to provide responses to issues.
- Present and participate in educational programs directed towards improving bicycle safety.
- Meet with members of the City Council on a monthly basis regarding downtown issues and compliance regarding local laws and ordinances.
- Develop and present training sessions to other law enforcement personnel and city agencies regarding bicycle related subjects and safety within the downtown.
- Conduct in-depth investigations into various crimes that affect the downtown area (i.e. drug sales, prostitution, alcohol sales to minor, etc.).

# **Neighborhood News**

## **DeMeo Park Tree**

The California black walnut (*Juglans hindsii*) tree in DeMeo Park is in a state of decline. It's a very old tree and no longer able to regenerate branches and roots. This tree suffered root zone disturbance when the new play equipment was installed a few years back. Similar to valley oak trees, black walnut trees have a poor tolerance to development impacts. Black walnut trees are intolerant of root loss, changes in the water table, and mechanical injury.

To protect the DeMeo Park black walnut and park users, the Parks Division strongly recommends a split rail fence around the drip line. A fence will help protect the critical root zone from further negative impacts, such as soil compaction. We need to discourage picnics or people gathering under the black walnut's canopy. Park staff will monitor the tree for further signs of decline or vigor. We are hoping by protecting the root zone we can help this black walnut tree remain a fixture of DeMeo Park for many more years.


